The plans outlined include the hybrid model where primary school students will be put into two groups and attend school for face-to-face instruction for two days. They will remain at home for the remaining three weekdays to complete assignments. Secondary students will also attend school for two days and remain at home for the other days, using a six-day learning cycle.

The Hon. Minister Glenys Hanna Martin and State Minister Zane Lightbourne headed the panel along with Director of Education Marcellus Taylor, ADE Sharmaine Sinclair and Actg. Chief Medical Officer Dr. Phillip Swann. Moderator Clint Watson fielded live questions from Facebook, MOE text messages, and parents.
